This Report to Donors provides an overview of how your gifts, which totalled \$7.71 million in 2013, are making an impact here in our own community and around the world.

This year's total represents an increase of \$70,000 over the total raised in 2012, which is particularly gratifying, given the number of other capital campaigns underway in the community.

Federation's Allocations Planning Committee conducted a comprehensive review of local partner agency funding applications in order determine how the available funds would be shared. Similarly, our Israel and Overseas Affairs Committee reviewed and made recommendations on overseas allocations.

Your gifts will fund programs and services that build brighter futures for youth at risk in Northern Israel; connect Jewish young adults with community - and each other; create pathways to Jewish life for our children and families; and help seniors stay healthy and engaged in Jewish community life. Thanks for making these, and all of the other programs supported by our community, possible.





The Allocations Planning Committee is in the first year of a two-year planning cycle. It conducted a comprehensive review of partner agency funding applications, including an assessment of their program evaluations and emerging community needs to determine how funds were distributed locally. Your gift to the Federation Annual Campaign provides a consistent base of funding for programs that ensure a strong, vibrant and enduring Jewish community in the Lower Mainland.

FUNDING HIGHLIGHTS

- » \$42,000 will support the ongoing operation of JHUB Richmond to provide home support, case management and counselling services to the Richmond Jewish Community.
- » \$6,000 to Kehila Society of Richmond to undertake a new kosher Meals on Wheels program in collaboration with the local synagogues.
- » \$12,000 to the Jewish Seniors Alliance to expand their peer services to frail and socially isolated seniors.
- » \$814,000 to Jewish Day Schools to include one new day school, and support growing enrollment at Vancouver Talmud Torah and King David High School.
- » \$209,400 to Hillel BC to address expanded programming.

ISRAEL & OVERSEAS \$2,221,146

The Israel and Overseas Affairs Committee reviewed a range of existing and new programs being delivered by partner agencies that ensure long-term economic and social stability for Jews living overseas and in Israel, and strengthen the Canadian-Israeli relationship. Your gift to the Federation Annual Campaign goes to much-needed programs that provide a safety net for the most vulnerable Jews across the diaspora.

FUNDING HIGHLIGHTS

- » \$50,000 will support life-changing Taglit-Birthright Israel trips for young adults.
- » Over \$600,000 of the Israel and Overseas allocation will go to programs focused on at-risk youth and vulnerable populations in our partnership region of the Upper Galilee panhandle. These programs help to break the cycle of poverty and contribute to the region's social and economic prosperity.
- » Critical rescue and relief needs in Ukraine and in more than 60 countries around the world will be addressed through an allocation of \$120,000 through our trusted partner, the Joint Distribution Committee (JDC).
- » We will continue to **build connections to Israel** by supporting locally based programs that reinforce the ties between our communities through events such as Yom Hazikaron and Yom Ha'atzmaut.

S NATIONAL \$430,150

Your gift to the Federation Annual Campaign, as well as contributions from other communities, fund the operations of national partner agencies that coordinate shared programs and services across the country.

- » The Centre for Israel and Jewish Affairs (CIJA) will ensure that causes important to Canada's Jewish community are, likewise, important to Canadian leaders in a range of key sectors, including government, media, universities, civil society, and other faith and ethnic communities.
- » The **Canada Israel Experience** will provide administration coordination for the Taglit-Birthright Israel program.
- » We will support Jewish programs and services at Canadian university campuses, including leadership training.



2013 FEDERATION ANNUAL CAMPAIGN FACTS

A total of **2,944** donors contributed. An additional **\$70k** was raised in 2013. The average gift to the campaign was \$2,622. A total of 350 new gifts were recieved. 258 canvassers contacted the community for pledges and gifts. **1,100+** community members joined together to kick off the 2013 Federation Annual Campaign Opening with Jason Alexander.
